*NOTE regarding lower-level French courses: After consulting with the French Program Coordinator students may begin one level below that for which they have qualified if they have not taken French for several years or if they lack confidence in the adequacy of their preparation. Placement tests may be given.

FRENCH PREREQUISITES:

- Students with Gr. 12 French enter FREN 205, 206 if their Gr. 12 average in French is 75% or higher.
 - Students whose Gr. 12 average in French is below 75% may enter FREN 111, 112, after consulting with the French Program Coordinator, if they feel unprepared to enter FREN 205, 206.
 - French immersion students register for FREN 205.
- **NOTE:** A total of 30 s.h. of credit, including a minimum of 18 s.h. of upper-level credit is required to complete a Concentration. A total of 24 s.h. of credit, including a minimum of 12 s.h. of upper-level credit is required to complete a Minor. A minimum overall (cumulative) GPA of 2.00 is required for graduation.
- **NOTE:** In order to be eligible for graduation you must complete an Application for Graduation via the Student Portal and submit a completed checklist to the Office of the Registrar by April 30 of the year prior to your completion (there is no fee to apply for graduation). Once your complete application has been received, a degree audit will be completed for you. This audit will confirm which courses are still outstanding in order for you to complete your degree.



