Selecting the Appropriate Agency

SSHRC – Social Sciences & Humanities

The intended outcome of the research must primarily be to add to our understanding and knowledge of individuals, groups, and societies - what we think, how we live and how we interact with each other and the world around us.

NSERC – Natural Science & Engineering

The intended objectives of the research must primarily be to advance knowledge in one or more of the natural science or engineering disciplines.

CIHR – Health

The intended outcomes of the research must primarily improve or have an impact on health and/or produce more effective health services and products and/or strengthen the Canadian health care system.



Agency Specific Doctoral Awards

- Each agency has its own doctoral awards for meritorious applications
- Applicants submit only one application to be considered for both the CGS-D and the agency specific awards
- Eligibility requirements may differ for agency specific awards
- Tenable within Canada or abroad



CIHR Doctoral Award

- Maximum of \$35,000
- Up to three years
- Abroad only

Canada Graduate Scholarships – Doctoral program

The Canada Graduate Scholarships – Doctoral program (CGS-D) provides special recognition and support to students who are pursuing a doctoral degree in a health-related field **in Canada**.

Doctoral Foreign Study Award

The Doctoral Foreign Study Award (DFSA) provides special recognition and support to students who are pursuing a doctoral degree in a health-related field abroad.



At a glance

Named after Major-General Georges P. Vanier, the first francophone Governor General of Canada, the Vanier Canada Graduate Scholarships (Vanier CGS) program helps <u>Canadian institutions</u> attract highly qualified doctoral students.

- Valued at \$50,000 per year for three years during doctoral studies
- Considers three equally weighted <u>selection criteria</u>: <u>Academic Excellence</u>, <u>Research Potential</u>, and <u>Leadership</u> (potential and demonstrated ability)

Nomination process

Candidates must be nominated by a Canadian institution with a <u>quota</u>* to host Vanier scholars. Candidates should only seek a nomination from the institution at which they want to study.

*The term "quota" refers to the maximum number of nominations an institution can forward to the national competition.

Knowledge Translation: Nursing Uptake and Patient **Outcomes Examined**

Best practice guidelines are vital resources in the provision of consistent and equitable cancer care by Registered Nurses. However, best practice guidelines are not readily used in cancer care and when they are available, this use is inconsistent. Previous research about the use and impact of practice guidelines has focused on the problems of professionals (mostly nurses and physicians) or the workplace itself. The purpose of this project is to use the expertise and knowledge of Registered Nurses while studying the interactions of the many different people involved in patient care (e.g. patients, family members, nurses and other members of the interprofessional care team) with each other and the workplace itself. These interactions influence and shape the everyday practices of healthcare. Greater understandings of these interactions leads to improved care and better outcomes for patients and their families.

The Team

In partnership with Mental Health Research Canada, Master of Nursing student Nikki Hunter-Porter is working with Dr. Lisa Bourque Bearskin, CIHR Indigenous Health Research Chair in Nursing and Associate Professor at Thompson Rivers University, to address gaps in Indigenous mental health services

The Challenge

The lack of Indigenous-specific mental health resources is a major contributor to Indigenous people being disproportionately affected by mental health challenges

The Solution

By harnessing an Indigenous approach to research to evaluate Indigenous mental wellness services, this study aims to determine the systemic factors impacting access and delivery of these services

The Outcome

While the research is ongoing, Hunter-Porter's project has received additional Mitacs funding, extending it to two internships and a full year of research
